The registration fee for grades K-8 remains at \$125.00
per student if paid **by April 30.** After that date it will be
\$250.00 per student grades K-8. Preschool registration
remains at \$75.00 if paid before **April 30,** or \$150.00 if
paid after that date. You may pay with credit card
through Fast Direct, the same site through which you
receive the weekly newsletter and updates from the
school. If you prefer to pay by check directly to the
school office, make the check payable to St. James
Lutheran School.

Tuition for next year is \$1600.00 per student in grades
K-8 for members of St. James, and \$2255.00 per student
for nonmembers. Preschool 5 days a week is also
\$1600. Four day preschool is \$1300.00 and three day
preschool is \$1000.00
