

HOLY COMMUNION INSTRUCTIONS...If you are a member of St. James, review p. 329 or the Ten Commandments in preparing to receive Jesus' body and blood for the forgiveness of your sins. If you are a guest, welcome! Communion at St. James is reserved for members of Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) congregations. Please speak with Pastor Loder about Communion before participating. If you know you will be visiting, it is best to call during the week before. If you are not communing but wish to receive a blessing, come forward with your hands crossed on your chest. **Didn't have a chance to talk with Pastor about Communion before church?** If you're a member of an LCMS congregation, you are welcome to Communion, but please let Pastor Loder know where you go to church when you come to the Communion rail. Please fill out a communion registration card and hand it to an Usher or put in the offering plate..

JESUS PRAYED THE PSALMS...When Jesus prayed, He prayed the Psalms. On the cross He cried, “*My God, My God, why have You forsaken Me?*” (Psalm 22), and “*Into Your hands I commit My spirit*” (Psalm 31). After the Last Supper, He and His disciples sang the Psalms traditionally used at Passover. If the Lord Himself prayed these inspired words, how much more may we learn from them! Continue this month’s discipline by praying a Psalm each day, letting Christ’s own prayer book shape your faith and your words.
