

<u>LUNCHES:</u> Although all students are able to have a free breakfast and a free lunch each day, it is a good idea to make sure you have your family account set up with HLWW. If you do not already have a lunch account, contact Michelle Johnson at the high school (320-543-4600). Each morning the students will be asked if they are having hot lunch, or brought their own, so that our cook will have the right amount of food prepared. The only charges made to your account this year will be: \$.50 for a carton of milk to go with a lunch brought from home, or if the student wants a second milk to go with their school lunch. Grades 5-8 are able to purchase a second entrée at a cost of \$2.00.

By going to the school website and using the Lunch payment tab, families can do online payments directly to HLWW. If you prefer to use checks for lunch payments, please make them out to ISD #2687, and drop them off in the school office. We will then deliver the check to HLWW.

As always if you would like to join your son or daughter at lunch, let the office know by 9:00 a.m. Cost for an adult meal is \$5.05 and may be deducted from the family account as long as there is money in the account.

<u>Yearbook order forms for the current school</u> <u>year</u> may be turned in to the school office. Cost is still \$15.00 per book.



From the Family Handbook PICK-UP PROCEDURES

No student will be permitted to leave the campus unless prior arrangements have been

made with a parent/guardian and school administration. Students riding the bus will be released first. Once the bus has left the front of the school,

the remaining students will be released to their parents/guardians.

Parents are to place their name sign in the passenger window and form a line that pulls up to the front of school. Students will be released in the order of the line. If parents choose to park in the parking lot, please come out of your vehicle

park in the parking lot, please come out of your vehicle and pick up your student.

Parents arriving early to pick up their student(s) should not park along the curb in front of the school until after the bus has arrived and departed.

Following this procedure will greatly help the teacher in charge of dismissal for that day. Thanks for your help!
