Thank you to all of you who have already registered your children for next year! If you have not done so yet, please find the field at the bottom of your home page to register for the upcoming school year. Please also verify your personal information by clicking the **View/Edit Parent Information** button.

It is easy to overlook the field for Cell Phone Provider on that parent information page. If you have a cell phone number in your parent account, you must select a cell phone provider in order for FDbroadcast or Text Notifications to work. Without a cell phone provider, these are the functions that will not be possible in FastDirect:

- *Text Notifications
- *FDbroadcast via text
- *Auto-notify via text



Registration fees are \$125.00 per child in grades K-8 and \$75.00 for preschool if paid before April 30. After that time the fee doubles. To register preschoolers, contact the school office either by email: school@stjameshl.org or by phone: 320-543-2630.

Tuition for 2024-2025 will be \$1800 for members and \$2500 for nonmembers. As always, financial assistance is available thanks to many generous donors.
