From the handbook:

<u>Tardies</u> ALL STUDENTS: Though typically outside of the control of the student, it is important to instill the integrity of being on time for responsibilities. If a family/student is running late, please contact the school office.

Students who arrive after 8 am without communication from parent/guardian will be counted as tardy. After the 5th tardy (during the school year), a conference will be scheduled between the parents/guardians and the principal/lead administrator to discuss solutions for getting the student to school on time.

5th-8th GRADE: Students are expected to be in their next class before the end of a 3-minute passing period. If there is a need to attend to a matter that will take longer than 3 minutes, it is the responsibility of the student to ask for permission to attend to the matter. Students who are not in the class at the time of the passing period bell unexcused will be marked tardy. After the 5th tardy (in one quarter), a conference will be scheduled between the students and principal/lead administrator to discuss solutions for getting to class on time. If the student continues to be tardy to classes, a detention will be assigned and held with the principal/lead administrator.
